Celebrating World Book Day at Green Meadow!








Year 4 created their own magical stories with Green Meadow as the setting.



British Science Week 2024

British Science Week is a celebration of everything science, technology, engineering and maths that will take place from 8th – 17th March this year and we can't wait to celebrate it at Green Meadow on Wednesday 13th March! The theme this year is 'Time' and we'll be celebrating by conducting lots of exciting investigations across school. Years 1 and 2 will be looking at 'Properties of Materials', Year 3 will be looking at and investigating the life and work of fossil expert, Mary Anning, Year 4 will be getting messy looking at human digestion, Year 5 will be investigating the effects of gravity on marbles and finally, Year 6 will be getting creative looking further into the history and electricity and energy in the UK. We can't wait to show you all the exciting things we get up to!

Home Learning

There is a competition being run by British Science Week to create a poster on the theme of the year, 'Time'. Children could create a poster showing how a certain type of technology has changed over time, or even the advancement of time-telling technology itself. Budding poster makers could also go futuristic and show us how they think the world might look in years to come, or perhaps look at nature – lifecycles, lifespans, evolution and hibernation – nature is full of timely topics!

British Science Week 2024 marks the Week's 30th anniversary, with the inaugural celebration happening in 1994. Students could think about scientific innovations since then, or explore 1994 itself – what was life like 30 years ago?! We will be looking for:

This term's parent-teacher meetings will take place after school on Wednesday, 13th March and Thursday, 14th March.


