Green Meadow Primary School was inspected by Ofsted on the 26th and 27th September 2023. We are all delighted with the 'Good' Ofsted grade and the gradings for each of the individual aspects of the inspection as we feel it encapsulates all of the progress we have made as a school since the previous inspection and it highlights all of the things that truly stand out at Green Meadow!

The inspection team highlighted the many positive features of the school in the report:

- The atmosphere in school is supportive, friendly and welcoming of all.
- As the school vision states, pupils are indeed ready, respectful and safe. They love learning and always show positive attitudes towards everything they are asked to do.
 - Pupils achieve well and are proud and excited to talk about their learning.
- Pupils behave well and treat one another kindly. There are clear rules and high expectations of everyone.
 - The school, with support from the trust, has put in place an ambitious, broad and successful curriculum.
- Teachers encourage and intentionally teach all pupils to communicate effectively in speech. This is consistent across the school and is highly effective.

- Pupils share their ideas and opinions clearly, and this helps deepen learning.
- Teachers successfully modify and adapt learning so that all pupils, including pupils with special educational needs and/or disabilities, can access the whole curriculum.
- Children get off to a good start learning to read. Throughout school, if pupils fall behind with their reading, adults help them to catch up.
 - In the early years, children settle quickly into routines. The curriculum is ambitious and well structured. Teachers know the children well and adjust activities to provide exactly what they need.
- The school and the trust engage successfully with parents. Parents feel informed and valued. Parents visit school regularly to celebrate their children's accomplishments and find out how to support learning.
- Pupils develop an excellent knowledge of personal, social and health education.
 They are learning to become active citizens who are tolerant, empathic and sensitive to differences and diversity. They are being very well prepared for life in modern Britain.
 - The curriculum extends well beyond the academic. Pupils get a range of wider experiences. The school carefully selects opportunities that help widen pupils' personal development.
- Leaders at all levels share a highly ambitious vision for this school. They have high expectations and a passion to provide the absolute best for every single pupil. They put their plans into action, enabling the school to go from strength to strength.

This is fabulous news for the whole school community and a brilliant example of our four values in action!

NEW RECEPTION INTAKE FOR SEPTEMBER 2024 SCHOOL APPLICATIONS



Applications for primary school applications for entry in September 2024 are open! The closing date is 15 January 2024 at 11:59pm.

You must apply on time. If you apply late, you are less likely to get offered a place at any of your preferred schools. Applications received after 15 January 2024 will be classed as late applications and will not be processed until after the offer of places.

Remember to list three different primary schools.

Important: Make sure you include details of any siblings attending your preferred school(s) in the field (box) provided for sibling details. Sibling details included in the incorrect field (box), such as in reasons for preference, will not be counted and may prevent you from gaining a place at your preferred school. Please note that if you fill in the online application incorrectly, you are responsible for not completing the form correctly, not School Admissions and Fair Access Service.

School meals are £2.35 per day, payable via Arbor, for years 3, 4, 5 \(\) 6, unless you are entitled to free school meals.

Please keep up to date with school meal payments each week.

Please note that for Reception, Year I and Year 2 <u>ALL</u> children are entitled to universal free school meals.
