We teach pupils how to speak confidently and articulately, how to listen carefully and how to agree and disagree respectfully. Above all, we value and celebrate our children's voices. I am delighted to be able to share with you that we have heard this week that Green Meadow has been recognised as a National Centre of Oracy Excellence by Voice 21! To gain this incredible award, a panel of judges met with staff and children to hear for themselves how Oracy has become embedded in our curriculum and they were blown away by the children! They couldn't believe how articulate and confident they are and were particularly impressed by how well they discuss and debate ideas in school. What an amazing achievement. Nationally, there are only 20 schools, including primary and secondary schools, who have been recognised as Centres of Excellence. Well done, everyone, and a special well done to Mrs Mullard for leading this so well in school. This is something for everyone to be really proud of!

This is in recognition of how well children are emotionally supported in school. Another well done to everyone, and in particular, Mrs Robinson and her team of TIAAS champions in school for their lead in this area.


CELEBRATION



Attendance: the top facts to know & share

The link between attendance and attainment is clear:

- In 2018/19, just 40% of persistently absent (PA) children in KS2 achieved expected KS2 standards, compared with 84% of pupils who were regular attenders.
- And 36% of PA children in KS4 got 9 to 4 in their English and maths GCSEs, also compared with 84% of regular attenders.¹

And it's never too late to benefit from good attendance:

 More than half (54%) of pupils who were PA in Year 10 and then rarely absent in Year 11, passed at least 5 GCSEs, compared to 36% of pupils who were persistently absent in both years.²

But attendance is important for more than just attainment:

 Regular school attendance can facilitate positive peer relationships, which is a protective factor for mental health and wellbeing.³


