












**KEEP READING!** 

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We are all passionate about reading in school! Reading is a key skill which is so important to any child's development at any age and it is also great fun! Please try to listen to your child read at least once a day (for 10-15 mins ideally). It's also great for children to listen to you reading aloud as well. To celebrate great reading in school, every week, class teachers nominate a 'Reader of the Week'! They collect a gold token from the office and head to the library with Mrs Stirrop to choose a book from our fabulous book vending machine! Who will it be next week, I wonder?

Questions to ask your child while reading fiction text. -Who is the main character? -What is the setting in the story? Does the setting change? -What was the problem in the story and how was it


Help your child become

solved? -Did the character change during the story? How? -How are you like the main character? How are you different?

-What do you predict will happen next in the story? -Why do you think the author chose this title for the story?

-Do you like the title of the story? Why or why not? -Can you think of a different title for the story? -Which character from the story would you choose to be your friend? Why?

-Which part of the story was the most exciting? Why? -Did you like the end of the story? Why or why not? -Which parts in the story could really happen? Which parts could not really happen?
