


Year One

Through the topics of Fire and Plague and Dinosaurs children will learn about the United Kingdom, to include places, locations and key features.


Year Four

### Extreme Earth



Extreme Earth focuses on the continent of Antarctica, its landscape, climate and its ecological importance in the future sustainability of the Earth. It will also cover other naturally occurring events such as volcanoes.

### Blue Planet



Children locate and describe the 5 major oceans and their position in relation to the continents. They consider the human environmental impact in more depth and think of ways to be environmentally responsible and live sustainably.

Through their Journeys topic, children will gain an understanding of the different reasons for human migration and how this impacts on individuals, communities and countries.

### Human Migration



Through mapwork investigation, children will increase their knowledge and understanding of Europe as a continent and how world events, such as war, can change the political landscape.

Year Six




