Dear Parents,

It's been another busy week here at Green Meadow and we're excited to share all the wonderful things that have been happening.

As you know, here at Green Meadow, we are proud to be an Oracy Centre of Excellence. Yesterday, we welcomed representatives from more than 25 primary schools across England to our Oracy Open Morning. Mrs Mullard took our visitors on a listening walk, and they were truly impressed by the way oracy is embedded throughout our lessons and by how confidently and eloquently our children speak about their learning. During the morning, the children shared their opinions thoughtfully and were able to challenge and respectfully disagree with viewpoints different from their own—demonstrating the high-quality oracy skills we value so much. A big thank you to Mrs Mullard for all her hard work in organising this event and to Mrs Calder for ensuring everything ran smoothly.

On Wednesday and Friday of this week, the children in Year 1 performed their class assemblies for their friends and families. They delighted the audience by sharing the story of Mrs Lather's Laundry, one of the books they have been reading in their English lessons. The assembly finished with a wonderful song about the days of the week. The children spoke and sang with such confidence - we are incredibly proud of them all.

Today, we took part in Children in Need Day. This is a wonderful event that raises money to support disadvantaged children and young people across the country. It was fantastic to see so many of our pupils dressed in yellow, covered in spots or proudly wearing Pudsey Bear clothing. The children also enjoyed the Pudsey Bear biscuits at break time, lovingly baked by our kitchen staff. Thank you for all your generous donations to this important charity. This week, our school participated in the national Anti-Bullying Week, an annual campaign coordinated by the **Anti-Bullying Alliance (ABA)** to raise awareness and promote inclusion. We kicked off the week with the colourful and fun "Odd Socks Day". Students and staff wore mismatched socks to celebrate individuality and unique differences. Throughout the week, children engaged with the official ABA assembly resources. The focus was on helping everyone understand the importance of confidentially, speaking up and supporting others. Children were given ideas on how to use their "Power for Good" through small acts of kindness, such as inviting someone to play, or knowing how to report a concern to a trusted adult.

We were delighted to welcome Parker, our new school dog mentor, into school this week. Parker is currently spending time getting accustomed to the sights, sounds and daily routines of our school. He has begun interacting with individual children and small groups, providing opportunities for engagement as he settles in. Once Parker is fully comfortable in his new environment, he will officially begin his important work in a supportive role, helping children throughout the school. 
GMPS ATTENDANCE BY NUMBER
